Renovations and Architects:

Completion of the \$11 million Golf Course Improvement Plan – October 2019 to July 2022.

Martin Ebert, of Mackenzie & Ebert International Golf Course Architects hired as the club's consulting architect in 2024.

The plan included reconstructing tees, bunkers, and greens on all 27 holes, including the West, South, and East courses, a new irrigation system, a practice putting green, and a new practice area.

Renovations continued and completed through the COVID-19 pandemic.

The course received Golf Digest's 'Best Renovation Award for 2022' in North America.

Maintenance Shop Construction Year: Original building was built in the late 1950's, there have been several additions, as well as building of several outbuildings
