Recent periods of drought and minimal rain during the key months of July August and September adds challenges to our water management plans.

The construction and development of a successful Bee Apiary that is managed by 4 team members two from the ground's department 1 from the kitchen and 1 from the Administration Office all have now become certified Beekeeper producing honey for the members to buy and to use in the clubhouse 2. The story of a group of members we call the invasive team, led by Mr. Bruce Brown this team has removed massive amounts of invasive plant materials that were overpopulating our non play areas, truly a remarkable story of older members that work very hard volunteering to improve our golf club, Each year we have a luncheon to recognize the tireless work these individuals do we are now seeing the benefits of there hard work as native plant material returns to flourish as they did 100 years ago.
